DENR ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO 12 Series of 1990

SUBJECT

Deputizing Governor Roberto Pagdanganan of Bulacan as Forest Officer of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources

Pursuant to the provisions of Presidential Decree No. 705 as amended **Governor Roberto Pagdanganan of Bulacan** is hereby deputized as Forest Officer of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, effective upon receipt hereof, of which this Office shall be informed accordingly.

By virtue of this deputation, he shall be authorized to detect/investigate violations of forestry laws, rules and regulations and to arrest even without warrant any person who has committed, is committing or is about to commit in his presence any of the offenses defined in Chapter IV of Presidential Decree No. 705 as amended within his territorial jurisdiction.

He is also authorized to seize/confiscate the tools and equipment used in committing the offense and the forest products cut, gathered or removed by the offender(s) in the process of committing the offense. In all instances of detection, arrest and/or seizure or confiscation he shall deliver within the period as prescribed by law from the time of arrest and seizure, the offender(s) and confiscated forest products, tools and equipment used and file the proper complaint with the appropriate officials designated by law to conduct preliminary investigation and file the information in court through the RED/PENRO/CENRO concerned.

He is further authorized to administer oath and take acknowledgement in official matters connected with the functions of his Office and to take testimony in official investigations conducted under the authority of the Revised Forestry Code, as amended and its implementing rules and regulations.

He shall submit to the PENRO/CENRO a monthly report of the case/s he has handled pursuant to this deputation order.

This deputation shall expire on December 31, 1990 or unless sooner terminated by this Office.
