

SUBJECT	:	REVISIONS TO THE ICC GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES AS UPDATED ON 4 AUGUST 2004 (RAISING THE ICC PROJECT COST FLOOR TO PhP500 MILLION)

- 1. The ICC Cabinet Committee discussed and adopted on 2 March 2005 the proposed subject revisions. This is consistent with the Presidential directive to "authorize agencies to approve contracts amounting to less than P500 million, except BOT, without going through the NEDA-ICC process, as long as DBM can certify the availability of funde, as reported by the Cabinet Secretary on 15 December 2004 (copy of memorandum attached). The ICC Guidelines and Procedures as updated on 4 August 2004 are thereby revised.
- Effective interactively, the scope of the ICC review and decision shall now cover major capital projects costing PhP500 million and above per project instead of the current PhP300 million project cost floor. The foregoing, however, excludes projects to be pursued through BOT and its variant schemes, for which the scope of ICC review shall cover the following:
  - (a) For projects of national line agencies and GOCCs implemented through the BOT and its variant schemes

Those costing up to PhP300 million shall be submitted to the ICC for its approval, and

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- II. Those costing more than PhP300 million shall be submitted to the NECA Board for its approval, upon recommendation of the ICC.
- (b) For local BOT projects to be implemented by local government units (LGUs) costing above PhP200 million.

 Approval of projects and contracts costing below PhP 500 million is delegated to heads of againcies and Governing Boards for GOCCs/GFIs subject to the following conditions;

- (a) The project is included in the Medium-Term Public Investment Program (MTPIP)
- (b) The project resource requirement is within the annual, multi-year budget ceiling of the agency or annual capital expenditure program of the GOCC/GFI as certified by the DBM and DOF, respectively. The certification of DOF shall consider the impact of the project on the CPSD.
- (c) The financial and economic viability as well as project benefits are established.
- (d) The agency/GOCC/GFI approval of the project is consistent with existing applicable laws, rules and regulations.
- The agency/GOCC/GFI shall submit to the ICC Secretariat, for information, pertinent documentation accordingly.
