# MATRIX OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ASEAN-GERMANY DEVELOPMENT PARTNERSHIP: PRATICAL COOPERATION AREAS 2018-2022

The ASEAN-Germany Development Partnership: Practical Cooperation Areas for ASEAN-Germany Development Partnership 2018 – 2022 was adopted at the Second ASEAN-Germany Development Partnership Committee (AG-DPC) on 20 March 2018. The Practical Cooperation Areas are aimed at implementing future cooperation under the framework of the ASEAN-Germany Development Partnership in order to further substantiate the Partnership and cooperation with a focus on practical areas for mutual benefits, where ASEAN and Germany have expertise and mutual interests. This Practical Cooperation Areas will also contribute to the realisation of ASEAN Community Vision 2025 goals as well as further strengthen ASEAN-Germany relations.

Subsequently, the ASEAN Secretariat has developed an implementation programme in the form of a matrix to reflect the list of indicative projects and activities to implement measures/actions under the Practical Cooperation Areas, as well as to assist in monitoring the implementation of the Practical Cooperation Areas.

Under the Practical Cooperation Areas, there are **19** measures/activities listed for implementation, which cover all three pillars of cooperation, namely political and security cooperation, economic cooperation and socio-cultural cooperation, as well as cross-sectoral areas, namely cooperation on connectivity, narrowing the development gap and Initiative for ASEAN integration (IAI) as well as sustainable development. **16** out of the 19 measures/activities, **4** under political and security cooperation, **6** under economic cooperation, and **6** under social and cultural cooperation.
