CONCEPT NOTE

Background and Rationale

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) is a highly dynamic and diverse region. Over the past 50 years, Southeast Asia has gone through rapid economic transformation, urbanisation and demographic shifts. This has brought remarkable gains on poverty reduction and improvements on the health and wellbeing of the ASEAN population, from increasing access to maternal care, to expanding the availability of basic water sources.

Nevertheless, rising inequalities continue to be a major challenge for sustainable development in the region. To meetASEAN's commitment to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the promise of leaving no one behind, the spotlight must be placed on those most at risk of lagging behind. This includes women and girls living in poorest rural households, in remote areas, or of ethnic minorities, among others. Only 10 years are now left to achieve the SDGs and the region requires accelerated change, especially to ensure development reaches those furthest behind. In this regard, it is important to identify specific policies and programme interventions to reach disadvantaged groups. Evidence-based planning and design is key to ensuring the success of these interventions.

Gender data disaggregated at multiple levels is essential to identify who the disadvantaged population groups are, where they live and the challenges they face. Without gender statistics, evidence-based policy decision making to address the principle of leaving no one behind is not possible. And yet, these data are often unavailable because microdata is not alwaysanalysed with a gender perspective. For instance, although statistics such as the proportion of households who have access

to clean water or the proportion of people who live in poverty are widely available, information on the proportion of women who live in such households, and on whether or not rural women are more likely to fall behind is not consistently generated or disseminated. More efforts are required to look at multidimensional poverty for both men and women in different social circumstances. This analysis, which is presented in the Gender Outlook, will help policy makers and relevant stakeholders examine different forms of deprivation and design policies and strategies to tackle these challenges among the disadvantage population in ASEAN countries, to include some findings on the impacts of COVID-19 pandemicon women and girls.

As such, turning the ASEAN Declaration on the Gender-Responsive Implementation of the ASEAN Community Vision 2025 and Sustainable Development Goals into action is now more essential than ever. In partnership with the ASEAN Committee on Women (ACW) and the ASEAN Secretariat, UN Women provides technical support to ensure gender-responsive localisation and implementation of the SDGs in view of the Complementaritiesbetween the ASEAN Community Vision 2025 and the 2030 Agenda: A Framework for Action, particularly for the production and use of gender data to inform policy actions that contribute to the principle of leaving no one behind.

Objectives

The ASEAN Committee on Women (ACW), with support from the ASEAN Secretariat (ASEC) and UN Women, jointly developed the ASEAN Gender Outlook, the first regional ASEAN flagship publication based on multiple deprivation analysis with the aim to:

- Generate SDG-related data that provides insights on who is lagging behind and what the challenges and opportunities are to lift them out of multidimensional poverty.
- Inform the development and implementation of the 2021-2025 work plans of relevantASEAN sectoral bodies, namely ACW, ASEAN Commission on the Promotion and Protection of the Rights of Women and Children (ACWC), Senior Officials Meeting on Social Welfare and Development (SOMSWD), and Senior Officials Meeting on Rural Development and Poverty Eradication (SOMRDPE),ASEAN Committee on Disaster Management (ACDM), among others.
- Provide evidence for key relevant stakeholders in ASEAN to formulate policy and programme interventions for advancing gender equality and empowerment of women in the region.
- Call for investment in gender and statistics for reporting progress towards the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs in the ASEAN region.
