This pertains to the letter dated 19 April 2021 from Smart Communications Inc., regarding the above-mentioned subject.

Smart Communications Inc. claims that to date, they have only secured around 11 tenurial instruments out of 106 applications for their cell sites nationwide. We have sent them the reports you submitted to apprise them of the situation of their application and to alert them on the way forward.

However, they are requesting to be allowed to secure provisional permits pending evaluation/completion of their application requirement.

Relative to this, you are hereby instructed to coordinate with them and discuss all possibilities in assisting them in accordance with pertinent rules, laws and regulations on the matter. Dear Undersecretary Cuna:

Greetings from Smart Communications, Inc!

We hope that you and your family are keeping safe amidst the ongoing pandemic. This letter is meant to report on SMART's ongoing endeavors pertinent to the SLUP & SAPA applications of 106 pre-identified cellsites throughout the Philippines. We also hope to present our current challenges and finally convey our recommendations.

Since 2018, SMART has reached out to all 14 DENR Regional Offices. Out of the 106 cellsites, we have so far secured only 11 SLUPs. Attached is a detailed accounting of the sites while below is the summary of the same:

We wish to share with you the challenges and the request of SMART for support relative to the application of these permits amid the limitations posed by the nationwide community quarantines.

We hope that our request will merit your review and consideration. It is our desire to be able to settle all our permitting obligations with DENR.

As you may be aware, a telecommunications tower ordinarily occupies only more or less three hundred (300) square meters. The infrastructure environmental footprint of SMART is very small compared to those in extractive industries and yet we are subjected to the same stringent DENR application process. Telecom projects are not identified in Presidential Proclamation 2146 as an environmentally critical project (ECP), which requires an impact assessment and environmental compliance certificate, wherever it is located. However, mindful of our duty to preserve the environment especially in Protected Areas, we still commit to provide a description of our project, outlining how we will manage our environment impacts. We do hope though that requirements and processes be more 'relaxed' in recognition of our non-extractive nature.

In this light, we would like to reiterate our request to secure Provisional Permits from the DENR, pending evaluation or completion of requirements. We are however willing to settle the assessed fees immediately.
