SUBJECT : **REQUEST FOR COMMENTS ON KOREA'S AND JAPAN'S TRANSPOSED SCHEDULE OF TARIFF COMMITMENTS (SOC) IN HS 2017 UNDER THE REGIONAL COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP (RCEP)**

This pertains to the letter dated 06 May 2021 from Dir. Angelo Salvador M. Benedictos of the Department of Trade and Industry - Bureau of International Trade Relations (DTI-BITR), requesting for comments on Korea's and Japan's SOC in HS 2017 under the RCEP.

It can be noted that during the 2nd RCEP Interim Joint Committee Virtual Meeting held on 15 March 2021, it was discussed that Signatory States will endeavor to circulate the transposed Tariff Reduction Schedule (TRS) accompanied by a two-way correlation table (CORTAB) by the end of April 2021. Nevertheless, for Signatory States who are ready with their TRS and CORTAB are encouraged to circulate them as soon as possible for the Signatory States to commence technical verification of the said schedules. It was also agreed that the technical verification should be completed by the end of September 2021.

During the Plenary Meeting of the Inter-Agency Committee on Trade in Goods (IAC-TIG) for the Line-by-line Review of the Philippine SOC in AHTN 2017 held on 15 March 2021, it was discussed that the transposed SOC's of the Signatory States will be circulated to the IAC-TIG for individual review of agencies.

In view of the foregoing, we would like to refer DTI-BITR's request to your respective Offices for comments on the attached Korea's and Japan's SOC. It is suggested to focus your review on the correctness of the transposition, particularly ensuring that the tariff commitments have been maintained. The DTI-BITR has also provided a copy of Korea's and Japan's tariff reduction schedules (TRSs) in HS 2012 to assist in your review. Dear Sirs/Mesdames:

This has reference to our letter dated 23 March 2021 on the transposition and technical verification of the SOCs of RCEP Signatory States to HS 2017 which is targeted to be completed by September 2021.

The Bureau received Korea's and Japan's transposed SOCs in HS 2017 accompanied by the two-way correlation tables (Annexes A and B). In this regard, we are respectfully requesting agencies to review the transposition of Korea's and Japan's SOCs. We suggest the review to focus on the correctness of the transposition, particularly ensuring that the tariff commitments have been maintained. To assist in the review, the Bureau is also sending a copy of Korea's and Japan's TRSs in HS 2012.

For reference, in addition to these two new SOCs, the Bureau has previously circulated the SOCs of Brunei Darussalam, China, Lao PDR, and New Zealand for the review of agencies. The status of the verification process is reflected in Annex C.
