THE SENATE PREMISES

Pertinent to the issuance of memoranda by the Senate regarding the prevention of the spread of COVID-19, the following guidelines shall take effect on October 1, 2020:

1. All offices shall be required to submit to the Office of the Sergeant at Arms (OSAA) the complete list of names of the resource persons, guests and visitors to enter the Senate premises at least one (1) day before the scheduled visit.

2. All resource persons, guests and visitors who are invited to attend committee hearings and meetings shall be required to submit a valid Medical Certificate from their attending Physicians or Berangay Health Officer indicating that they are free from COVID19 / COVID-19 symptoms with attached Negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result.

The medical certificate is only valid for Seven (7) days from date of issuance. The negative COVID 19 RT-PCR test result will only be valid for seven (7) days from the date of release of the results The certificates must be presented to the Senate Medical and Dental Bureau for review on the day of the committee hearing / meeting.

The committee secretaries and heads of all offices shall notify the invitees of this requirement.

3. Health Declaration Forms are to be filled out accurately by the resource persons, guests and visitors at the Sensie main looby upon entry.

Accordingly, the Office of the Sergeant at Arms (OSAA) to ensure that all personnel, resource persons, guests and visitors strictly observe the safety health protocols while in the Senate premises to prevent the local transmission of the virus.

PARTICIPANT'S GUIDE: ONLINE/VIDEOCONFERENCE PUBLIC HEARING

To ensure orderly conduct of hearings, please observe and be reminded of the following:

BEFORE THE HEARING

- 1. Participants are encouraged to <u>download</u> the Cisco Webex app on their laptops or mobile devices.
- 2. For ease of verification, participants are requested to use their official and full name when joining the meeting. (Ex. DENR Juan Dela Cruz) The name displayed must also include the agency/organization from where the participant comes from. Participants who are not on the official list of the Committee will not be allowed in the virtual meeting room.
- 3. The meeting link and access code will be sent out an hour before the hearing to the designated e-mail addresses of all Senators and resource persons. (Kindly check SPAM folder.) Only the Senators and resource persons who confirmed their attendance will receive the meeting link or access code. This information is confidential and may not be shared.
- 4. Upon clicking the meeting link, a participant is automatically put in a virtual lobby while waiting for the hearing to begin. Participants are encouraged to join the meeting ahead of schedule so that potential technical and accessibility concerns can be addressed. The Committee may also request for a test run before the official hearing starts.
- 5. The "meeting room" will be locked 15 minutes after the hearing starts. As the system does not have a notification system to the Host in the case of late or locked out participants, in the event that a confirmed participant will be joining after the 15-minute mark, the participant should send a message to the host via SMS at **0956-1571589 (Atty. Rachel L. Yuayan)** to be included in the hearing.

During the Hearing

- All microphones are put on mute by default. To prevent unnecessary background noise, participants are discouraged from turning on the microphone unless recognized to speak by the Chairperson or any Member of the Committee.
- 2. Participants/guests are requested to always maintain proper decorum and appear in appropriate office attire as those observed and used in regular face to face hearing/meetings in the Senate.
- 3. Participants who want to be recognized may use the 'Raise-Hand' button, which is a small hand icon next to the participant's name in the Participant Panel. The speaking sequence will be determined in the order that the request was made, or as otherwise agreed upon by the Committee Members. A participant may only speak upon being recognized by the Chairperson or any Member of the Committee. The duly recognized participant may then unmute the microphone or let the Host do it.
- 4. For resource persons who want to make a presentation, all files must be pre-approved by the Committee one (1) business day before the hearing. During the hearing, upon recognition by the Chairperson or any Member of the Committee, the participant may ask permission to present the pre-approved document before the Host can enable the Share File function. Files not previously approved by the Committee may not be presented.
- 5. Participants are requested to virtually remain in the meeting until the end of the hearing.
- 6. The meeting will be recorded for documentation. The Committee, as the Host, has the function to record the meeting.
- 7. For all other non-participants, the hearing may be monitored via the Senate Live Webcast.
- 8. All other concerns may be sent via private message to the Host in the <u>chat box</u>.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

As stated in the Philippine Development Plan 2017-2022, the country has a total housing need of approximately 6.80 million units, with a housing backlog of 2.02 million as of December 2016. A huge number of this are households in "unacceptable housing," i.e. those living rent-free without consent of the owner, homeless, those in dilapidated or condemned structures, and those in marginal housing units. Moreover, as of 2011, there are 1.50 million informal sector families (ISFs) nationwide, almost 40% of which are in Metro Manila.

However, socialized housing development programs are hampered by slow process of land acquisition, limited affordable land, problems in resettlement site development, among others. At times, informal settler families hesitate to move to resettlement areas due to lack of livelihood opportunities and inadequate access to basic services and utilities.


This bill proposes the creation of a rental housing subsidy program to provide direct financial aid to informal settler beneficiaries who are living in indecent, inhuman and unsafe shelters. The program is intended to allow them to immediately and temporarily relocate into safe and suitable rental housing spaces, and assist them to ease into ownership of their own permanent housing units under the formal socialized, economic and low-cost housing mechanisms.

The measure is also consistent with on-site and in-city resettlement thrust of our housing programs, especially in relocating households affected by government infrastructure projects and natural calamities.

In this light, the immediate passage of this bill is hereby sought.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representative of the Philippines in Congress assembled;

1	Section 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Rental Housing Subsidy

Eligible beneficiaries shall receive a rental subsidy, the amount of which shall be determined by the DHSUD taking into consideration, among others, the prevailing rental rates in the concerned locality and the economic standing and potential of the family. The subsidy shall be a percentage of the total amount of rentals as determined by the rental or lease contract between the eligible beneficiary and the lessor, provided that for those eligible beneficiaries below the poverty threshold as determined by the Philippine Statistics Authority, the subsidy shall be at least 60% of the total amount of rentals.

Notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary, at any time but not more than once every two (2) years, subsidies given under the program shall be reviewed or revised to conform to prevailing economic conditions.

Rental subsidy shall be granted to eligible beneficiaries for a maximum of five (5) years or upon their availment or acquisition of permanent housing, whichever comes first.

- Sec. 5. *Eligibility* To be an eligible beneficiary under this Act, an individual or household must:
 - (a) Live under any of the conditions under Sec. 3, paragraph b, of this Act;
 - (b) Have a source of livelihood or have at least one (1) member of the household gainfully employed; and
 - (c) Vacate the informal settlement area in which they are presently living and transfer or relocate to a safer area.
- Sec. 6. Conditions for Continued Entitlement or Eligibility. All eligible beneficiaries shall comply with the following conditions for continued availment of the benefits under this Act:
 - (a) The beneficiaries shall not move or relocate back to the area in which they were originally living in unless such move or relocation has been permitted by the proper government authorities taking into consideration the purpose of the program; and
 - (b) The beneficiaries shall pay that portion of the rentals not subsidized under the program to the lessor.

- Sec. 10. *Appropriations*. The amount necessary for the effective implementation of this Act shall be charged against the current appropriations for the DHSUD. Thereafter, such amounts as necessary for its continued implementation shall be included in the General Appropriations Act.
 - Sec. 11. Inter-Agency Cooperation and Adoption of Simplified Procedures. —
 The concerned government agencies shall endeavor to simplify the procedures for application, certification and release of subsidies to the beneficiaries. They shall also endeavor to create one-stop centers, a common location or single website/portal, which can receive and process applications, in accordance to Republic Act No. 11032 otherwise known as the "Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act."
 - Sec. 12. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* The DHSUD, in coordination with relevant government agencies, shall issue rules, regulations, and guidelines necessary to carry out the intent and purposes of this Act within six (6) months from the date of effectivity.
 - Sec. 13. Mandatory Review on the Implementation of this Act. The DHSUD shall submit to the Congress a report on the implementation of this program at the end of the second (2nd) year from the date of effectivity and every two (2) years thereafter.
 - Sec. 14. *Separability Clause.* If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision or part not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.
 - Sec. 15. *Repealing Clause.* Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule, or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.
 - Sec. 16. *Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
