REQUEST FOR FURTHER COMMENTS ON THE DENR'S POSITION ON THE UNILATERAL WITHDRAWAL OF THE NATIONAL COMMISSION OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES (NCIP) TO THE JOINT DAR-DENR-LRA-NCIP ADMINISTRATIVE

ORDER (AO) 01 SERIES OF 2012

This refers to the meeting of the National Intelligence Board last 29 October 2021 where one major agenda was the presentation of land conflicts. A Technical Working Group Report by DPWH, DENR, DAR, DA, NCIP and LRA was presented and two (2) of the points that were raised during the presentation include: (a) operational issues identified can be addressed by the Joint DENR-DAR-DILG-NCIP Administrative Order (AO) which was suspended by the NCIP and (b) basic policy issues that need to be addressed regarding land classification of Ancestral Lands vis-à-vis forest lands and related matters (overlapping lands). National Security Adviser and Director General Secretary Esperon suggested that we hold a meeting on the said issues.

During the meeting to discuss the proposed agenda on the above meeting/ preparation for the meeting regarding the issues on land conflicts last 20 December 2021 of this Office, Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB), Forest Management Bureau (FMB), and Land Management Bureau (LMB), LMB raised that a Memorandum dated 07 August 2020 on the DENR's Position on the Unilateral Withdrawal of the NCIP to the Joint DAR-DENR-LRA-NCIP AO 01 Series of 2012 was forwarded to the Undersecretary for Policy, Planning and International Affairs and the Undersecretary for Legal, Administration, Finance, Human Resources and Information Systems through the Assistant Secretary for Policy, Planning and Foreign Assisted and Special Projects, and Chairperson of the DENR-TWG on JAO 1 series of 2012.

In line with this, may we request for your further comments on the said position paper to address the policy issues on the land conflicts. Attached herewith is the abovementioned Memorandum from the LMB. Kindly submit your comments/ concurrence to this Office not later than 3 January 2022, Monday.

This is with reference to the En Banc Resolution No. 08-03-2019 of the NCIP expressing their withdrawal from the JAO 01 s. 2012, and membership to the Joint National Committee (JNC).

Based on the Resolution, the NCIP's withdrawal is mainly because of the non-compliance of the other agencies to the provisions of the JAO and the absence of permanent representatives to the JNC.

Admittedly, the provisions of the JAO and its Implementing Procedures were not effectively and efficiently implemented, but the DENR considers it as still the best venue and mechanism to address the issues concerning the mandates of the four (4) agencies. We find it best to discuss the issues at the JNC level and identify needed improvements to meet its objectives. Hence the following are recommended:

- 1. The NCIP resume participation in the JNC meetings and that agencies be required to attend with their highest level of representation.
- 2. The JAO and its Implementing Procedures be revisited and improved including necessary funding requirement. This is already being discussed in the ongoing meetings of the JNC currently headed by DAR with solutions already identified.

3. Consider having the JAO upgraded to an Executive Order and headed by the Cabinet Secretary to provide oversight or strengthen resolution mechanism in the event that the agencies cannot agree among themselves on the approach to solving.

We have also consolidated the recommendation/response of the DENR to the issues and concerns raised by the NCIP as follows:
