TRADE POLICY REVIEW BODY

REPORT TO THE TPRB ON TRADE-RELATED DEVELOPMENTS

In preparation for the next series of trade monitoring reports, I would like to invite all delegations to provide the WTO Secretariat's Trade Monitoring Section (Mr Peter Pedersen, contact details above) with information on (1) all trade and trade-related measures and (2) measures taken specifically in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic between mid-October 2021 to mid-May 2022 including any updates to and/or elimination of existing measures.

Since I took office, I have been emphasizing the importance of transparency for the WTO as it is fundamental to any well-functioning global governing body. Transparency directly affects the credibility of the work we do at the WTO and helps equip Members with up-to-date information on trade-related developments. In these efforts, the trade monitoring reports (WTO-wide and G20) are unquestionably a main tool in enhancing transparency. And your inputs are essential in assisting the Secretariat to prepare the Reports in the most accurate and comprehensive manner. I therefore ask for your support in providing as complete information as possible in a timely manner.

In providing information on the two sets of measures as outlined above, for goods trade, please indicate the HS Codes of the products concerned. In the area of services trade, delegations are invited to provide information on changes to – or the introduction of new – measures affecting access to markets (in individual service sectors, in all sectors, and/or modes of supply) and conditions of operation of foreign service suppliers. In cases where measures were already notified to the WTO, please simply refer to the document reference. In the area of general economic support measures, Members are invited to provide information on such measures - granted, modified, or withdrawn during this period - including industry specific and sectoral assistance.

It would be appreciated if your inputs could be received by Monday, 25 April 2022 at the latest to allow the Secretariat to return the relevant country-specific tables for your verification shortly thereafter. Measures taken between 25 April and 15 May 2022 will also be covered during the verification process.

Attached is an illustrative list of measures (restrictive or facilitating) affecting trade in goods, services sectors and modes of supply, general economic support measures and intellectual property covered by the Trade Monitoring Reports. Following the outcomes of the TPRM Appraisal in 2016, and with the objective of ensuring consistency in the format and length of information provided by Members, the attached suggested template is provided for submitting your inputs. The same template can be used for both trade and trade-related measures as well as measures taken in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic. Members are also encouraged to provide information on trade concerns raised in formal meetings of WTO bodies (other than the SPS and TBT Committees).

I would like to recall that the purpose of this exercise, as stated in the TPRM mandate in Annex 3 of the Marrakesh Agreement Establishing the WTO, is to achieve greater transparency in, and understanding of, Members' trade and trade-related policies and measures. It is not intended to serve as a basis for the enforcement of obligations under WTO Agreements, nor for dispute settlement purposes, or to impose new policy commitments on Members.
