## Bangkok Goals on Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Economy<sup>1</sup>

#### Introduction

- 1. We, the APEC Leaders, reiterate our commitment to pursuing a strong, balanced, secure, sustainable and inclusive growth in the Asia-Pacific<sup>2</sup>.
- 2. Since 1993, APEC has emphasised the importance of quality growth and sustainable development with various APEC fora adopting plans and initiatives to promote sustainable approaches. In 2020, we agreed to advance APEC's sustainability objectives, making firm commitments in the Putrajaya Vision 2040 to promote economic policies, cooperation and growth, which support global efforts to comprehensively address all environmental challenges, including climate change, extreme weather and natural disasters, for a sustainable planet. In 2021, we agreed on concrete collective actions in the Aotearoa Plan of Action in order to achieve this aim.
- 3. Now, in 2022, members have identified the need to go one step further and outline how APEC can achieve its comprehensive, high-quality and ambitious sustainability objectives, while reinforcing and contributing to ongoing global actions. For leverage points, we explored approaches such as the bio-circular-green (BCG) economy model that calls for more holistic and synergised efforts and shifting of our mindset and actions necessary to address the inherent imbalances and inequalities in our economies. To drive their practical application, such efforts must build on APEC's existing commitments and workstreams as well as consider new aspirational targets and workstreams to further APEC's sustainability objectives.

## Goals, Key Areas, and Aspiring Targets and Workstreams

- 4. To that end, APEC will marshal existing targets and workstreams (Annex) in conjunction with the following goals, key areas and aspiring targets:
  - a. Supporting climate change mitigation, adaptation and resilience and the achievement of net zero carbon emissions by:
    - Contributing to the work under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Paris Agreement and the Glasgow Climate Pact, including in holding the increase in the global average temperature well below 2°C above preindustrial levels and pursuing efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels<sup>3</sup>. APEC members recognise that the latter requires rapid, deep and sustained reductions in global greenhouse gas emissions, including reducing global carbon dioxide emissions by 45 per cent by 2030 relative to the 2010 level and to net zero around mid-century as well as deep reductions in other greenhouse gases<sup>4</sup>;
    - Enhancing climate change adaptation and resilience;
    - Advancing the transition to clean and green energy, strengthening energy resilience and ensuring energy access, including by exploring updating the APEC energy intensity reduction and renewable energy doubling goals;
    - Promoting sustainable food systems and agricultural practices;
    - *Promoting* the development of cost effective low and zero emissions technologies, sustainable finance and, if appropriate, carbon pricing mechanisms.
  - b. Progressing sustainable trade and investment by:
    - Intensifying work that minimises disruption to, enhances resilience and promotes sustainability of supply chains, as well as improves connectivity, including through advancing cooperation on green public procurement practices;

- Continuing work on the facilitation of trade in Environmental Goods and Services, including by fulfilling the implementation of the 2012 APEC List of Environmental Goods:
- Advancing concrete actions on responsible business conduct and green, low-carbon industry practices, including in the tourism, digital and technology sectors,
- Enhancing economic integration and empowerment of women and advancing the roles of MSMEs, including encouraging the formulation of a new APEC Strategy for Green, Sustainable and Innovative MSMEs;
- c. *Promoting* sustainable management of resources and conservation of the environment and biodiversity by:
  - Promoting sustainable management of marine resources and sustainable fisheries;
  - Continuing work to combat marine debris;
  - Continuing work to combat illegal logging and associated trade and promote trade in legally harvested forest products, including through further improving transparency and trackability of timber supply chains, as well as *promoting* sustainable forest management and rehabilitation.
- d. Advancing resource efficiency and sustainable waste management towards zero waste by:
  - Exploring a framework to advance circular economy approaches.

#### **Implementation**

- 5. To implement the above, we emphasise the need to adopt an inclusive approach that mainstreams gender and empowers women, youth, local communities and other groups with untapped economic potential. Further, we stress the need for stronger whole-of-society partnerships and whole-of-system approaches within APEC, particularly across all fora and sub-fora namely SCE, CTI, EC, BMC and FMP and their substructures in order to deliver comprehensive, coherent and mutually-reinforcing outcomes.
- 6. The following enablers should be accelerated through relevant APEC mechanisms:
  - a. Conducive regulatory frameworks, including through structural reform, good regulatory practices and international regulatory cooperation, particularly utilising the findings and recommendations of the 2022 APEC Economic Policy Review (AEPR) on Structural Reform and a Green Recovery from Economic Shocks and the subsequent AEPRs to inform policies and approaches.
  - b. Capacity building by deepening economic and technical cooperation, technology transfer, the exchange of knowledge, expertise and best practices to achieve sustainable and inclusive growth, as well as promoting inclusive human capital development, especially reskilling and upskilling.
  - c. Facility and infrastructure development and investment, as well as further leveraging science, technology, innovation and digitalisation.
  - d. Global networks within and among governments, private sector, financial sector, academia, other international and regional organisations, and groups of other relevant stakeholders, as well as mechanisms within and related to APEC, including ABAC, APEC permanents observers namely ASEAN, PECC, PIF and the APEC Study Centers,
- 7. Cognizant of the ongoing efforts to streamline and improve efficiency, we instruct the APEC Committees and relevant Working Groups to mainstream and advance the above agenda in their respective strategies and workplans, as well as deepen cross-fora collaboration. We further instruct the APEC Secretariat to maintain an evergreen compendium of the actions and initiatives undertaken as the means to review our progress. Through furtherance of the sustainability agenda in a comprehensive, high-quality and ambitious manner, we will put APEC on a growth trajectory towards a more balanced, inclusive, sustainable and resilient post-COVID-19 future.
