SUBJECT : **INVITATION TO THE ORIENTATION AND LEVELLING- OFF WORKSHOP FOR THE ABANDONED, UNDEVELOPED AND UNDERUTILIZED FISHPONDS (AUU) IN RELATION TO FISHPOND LEASE AGREEMENT (FLA)**

DATE : 23 SEP 2022

In support to the NCI- SRD Joint Resolution No. 06 Series of 2020, also known as the Creation of the Inter-Agency Technical Working Group (TWG) under Section 14 of the Joint DA- DENR-DILG Administrative Order (JAO) No. 01., Series of 2008 to address the policy issues on the Abandoned, Undeveloped and Underutilized (AUU) Fishponds in relation to Fishpond Lease Agreement (FLA), a DENR Special Order No. 2021 – 274 was issued on 25 May 2021 to create a DENR National and Regional Technical Working Group for the reversion of AUU and mangrove rehabilitation concerns.

One of the identified strategies for the smooth implementation of this initiative is to conduct a brief orientation and leveling-off workshop discussing Abandoned, Undeveloped, and Underutilized Fishponds (AUUF), and their status in the Philippines. In order to commence activities of the said technical working group the workshop is proposed to be held in **Iloilo from 17-21 October 2022**. This activity is being held in partnership with the Sustainable Interventions for Biodiversity, Oceans and Landscape (SIBOL) Project. Attached is the draft schedule of activities for your information (**Annex A**).

The objectives of the workshop are as follows:

1. To orient DENR Bureaus, Regional and Field Offices on the general overview of the AUU FLAs, specifically on the history, legal bases, data, and its implication on managing our coastal and marine resources;
2. To promote awareness/appreciation of the need for urgency on reverting AUUs.
3. To consult with the field implementers on their pressing issues and concerns in relation to AUU FLAs;
4. To present and discuss the draft guidelines on the process of reverting AUU FLAs back to mangrove forests.
5. To identify the next steps and facilitate action planning on how to address this issue.

SUBJECT: CREATION OF THE DENR TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP FOR THE REVERSION OF THE ABANDONED, UNDEVELOPED AND UNDERUTILIZED (AUU) FISHPONDS AND OTHER RELATED MANGROVE CONSERVATION AND REHABILITATION POLICIES

In the interest of the service and in support to the NCI-SRD Joint Resolution No. 06 Series of 2020, also known as the Creation of the Inter-Agency Technical Working Group (TWG) under Section 14 of the Joint DA-DENR-DILG Administrative Order (JAO) No. 01., Series of 2008 to address policy issues on the Abandoned, Undeveloped and Underutilized (AUU) Fishponds in relation to Fishpond Lease Agreement (FLA), the DENR National and Regional TWG, is hereby created to consist of the following:

Roles and Responsibilities of the National TWG:

1. Prepare and consolidate DENR's position with regards to AUU fishponds based on existing policies;
2. Consolidate maps from old Land Classification Office and NAMRIA pertaining to forestlands turned over to DA-BFAR for purposes of fishpond development/Fishpond Lease Agreements (FLA);
3. Consolidate list of AUU FLAs for five (5) years from date of approval of the lease of contract from DA-BFAR officially turned over to DENR;
4. Create a common GIS database to serve as repository of all information pertaining to AUU and other mangrove areas, and upload the same in the DENR Geo-Portal for ease of access;
5. Provide guidance to the Regions in the validation/verification of cancelled AUU FLAs and other areas turned-over to BFAR for such purposes;
6. Intensify coordination efforts between DA-BFAR and DENR on fishponds with FLAs and NGP areas;
7. Prepare the action plan for the reversion process and the resolution of issues/concerns; and
8. Recommend appropriate policies.

Roles and responsibilities of the Regional TWG:

1. Provide existing data holdings of the DENR Region on AUU to the GIS database created by the National TWG;
2. Conduct validation/verification of cancelled and abandoned areas covered by FLAs based on guidance of the NTWG;
3. Recommend priority AUU areas for reversion to forestland;
4. Intensify coordination efforts between BFAR Regional and Provincial Fisheries Offices and DENR Regional and Field Offices on fishponds with FLAs and NGP areas; and
5. Perform other functions as may be required.


Roles and responsibilities of the National Secretariat:

1. Coordinate meetings, prepare correspondences and keep record of minutes of meetings and reports on the work of the TWG;
2. Perform secretariat functions during the TWG meetings;
3. Assist in the coordination with and between the IATWG and other partners for the timely accomplishment of the TWG targets;
4. Monitor the progress and accomplishments of the TWG as well as the implementation of the activities as agreed during the IATWG meetings;
5. Assist in the inclusion of the target activities and corresponding financial requirements to the Work and Financial Plan of the Department; and
6. Perform other functions as may be assigned by the TWG Chairperson and/or higher authorities.

Both the national and regional TWG may invite representative/s from the academe and/or Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) during consultation meetings and validation activities. The same shall also represent DENR in the IATWG created under NCI-SRD Resolution No. 06 Series of 2020.

All expenses to be incurred in line with the implementation of this Order shall be charged against each respective office, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

This Order shall take effect immediately.
