Ramos sought clarification on the intent of the Codification project; whether it will be vertical or horizontal codification; and if the objective is for the Department to submit a single bill. In reply, Mr. Gerochi explained that the codification will involve the fundamental laws of the sectors and coming up with a code, hence, the implementation in two (2) phases. He mentioned past experiences regarding submission of codes (e.g., Land Code) in Congress which were not passed. Hence, the strategy identified is to amend portions of the sectoral laws and put all these together into a single code. To attain this objective, the sectoral laws will have to be harmonized internally.
- On the query of Atty. Ramos as to how the different sectoral laws will be merged into a single code, Mr. Gerochi stated that this can be done by identifying thematic areas. The undersigned noted that if the code will be structured according to thematic areas (e.g., conservation) and not by sectoral focus, all sectors will have to be involved. On the query of the undersigned regarding the implication of the amendment of the same portion of the code, Mr. Gerochi explained that amending a code is the same as amending a law; the amended portion of the law becomes a component of the code. If a law is amended, the code will have to be re-issued.
- Atty. Ramos asked whether the Legal Affairs Service (LAS) may submit its position on the intent of the Codification project and on the roles and responsibilities of the TWG. Mr. Gerochi informed that the Director of LAS has been consulted in the past regarding the project. The undersigned stated that the LAS plays a critical role in the project and assured that the inputs of said office are welcome. Additionally, it was stressed that the role of the TWG is to provide guidance to the consulting firm so that the output is aligned with the DENR's goals and not consultant-driven.
- With regard to function no. 1 of the TWG, i.e., identify areas of reform and complementation among the different ENR laws, Atty. Ramos wished to be clarified whether the leg-work will be done by the TWG. The PSD Secretariat responded that said function ensures that it is the TWG that will provide direction as to how conflicting areas/provisions will be addressed/approached, and this is not an area for the consulting firm to decide upon. Mr.

Gerochi stated that the consulting firm will provide external ideas and experience, and stressed that the project will be a group work between the TWG and the consulting firm. Atty. Ramos manifested that the leg-work should be handled by the consulting firm to be procured. Relatedly, she suggested that the said function of the TWG as indicated in Special Order No. 2023-33 be revised. For. Tabliga expressed agreement with the observation and point raised by Atty. Ramos. The undersigned stated that the Special Order may be revised anytime, and stressed that the TWG will provide guidance to the consulting firm and make sure that the outputs of the latter will be informed by the needs of the sectors.


On the pre-identified sectoral laws indicated in the scope and coverage, it was
