- (1) All trade and trade-related measures; and
- (2) Measures taken specifically in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.

For further information, kindly refer to the enclosed communication dated 10 March 2023 of the WTO Director-General Dr. Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala pertaining to the Report to the Trade Policy Review Body (TPRB) on Trade-Related Developments.

In this regard, we would like to refer the said request to your respective Offices for inputs. Please be guided that in the case of goods trade, kindly indicate the HS Codes of the products concerned. In the area of services trade, please provide information on changes to or the introduction of new measures affecting access to markets (in individual service sectors, in all sectors, and/or modes of supply) and conditions of operation of foreign service suppliers.

Additionally, kindly provide information on general economic support measures, including industry specific and sectoral assistance, which were granted, modified or withdrawn during this period. In cases where measures were already notified to the WTO, please indicate only the document reference number. Attached for your reference are the templates provided by the WTO Secretariat which you may use in providing your inputs (refer to **Annex A** for goods; **Annex B** for services; and **Annex C** for COVID-19 related measures).

The information provided will be used by the WTO Secretariat to prepare the Trade Monitoring Reports (WTO-wide and G20) in the most accurate and comprehensive manner. Measures taken between 18 April and 15 May 2023 will also be covered during the verification process.

#### TRADE POLICY REVIEW BODY

#### REPORT TO THE TPRB ON TRADE-RELATED DEVELOPMENTS

In preparation for the next series of trade monitoring reports, I would like to invite all delegations to provide the WTO Secretariat's Trade Monitoring Section (contact details above) with information on all trade and trade-related measures taken between mid-October 2022 to mid-May 2023, including any updates to and/or elimination of existing measures, including measures taken specifically in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.

As you know, I have been emphasizing the importance of transparency for the WTO as it is fundamental to any well-functioning global governing body. The outcomes of MC12 sent a strong signal in this regard. Transparency directly affects the credibility of the work we do at the WTO and helps equip Members with up-to-date information on trade-related developments. In these efforts, the Trade Monitoring Reports (WTO-wide and G20) are unquestionably a fundamental tool in enhancing transparency and predictability. Your participation in this exercise and your inputs are essential in assisting the Secretariat in the preparation of the Reports in the most accurate and comprehensive manner. I therefore ask for your support in providing as complete information as possible within the deadline.

Specifically, in providing information on trade and trade-related measures, for goods' trade, please indicate the HS Codes of the products concerned. In the area of services' trade, delegations are invited to provide information on changes to – or the introduction of new – measures affecting access to markets (in individual service sectors, in all sectors, and/or modes of supply) and conditions of operation of foreign service suppliers. In the area of intellectual property, information is sought on new developments or changes to existing policies. In cases where measures were already notified to the WTO, please simply refer to the document reference. In the area of general economic support measures, Members are invited to provide information on such measures – granted, modified, or withdrawn during this period - including industry specific and sectoral assistance.

It would be appreciated if your inputs could be received by Tuesday, <u>18 April 2023 at the latest</u> to allow the Secretariat to prepare the relevant country-specific tables for your verification shortly thereafter. Measures taken between 18 April and 15 May 2023 will also be covered during the verification process.

Attached is an <u>illustrative</u> list of measures (restrictive or facilitating) affecting trade in goods, trade in services, intellectual property and general economic support measures covered by the Trade Monitoring Reports. With the objective of ensuring consistency in the format and length of information provided by Members, the attached suggested template provides details on the information requested. The same template can be used for both trade and trade-related measures as well as measures taken in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Throughout 2022, as part of the Seventh Appraisal of the TPRM, delegations have been pursuing informal consultations on the trade monitoring exercise. I understand that these consultations will continue in 2023 and I urge delegations to actively participate.

In response to requests by delegations during the Appraisal to modernise and digitalise the exchange of information in the context of the trade monitoring exercise, I am pleased to inform you that the Secretariat has developed an online platform to facilitate the exchange of information and the verification of trade measures by Members. These new features are available in the Trade Monitoring Database. Tutorials have been developed to guide you on how to use the new platform. The Secretariat will send you shortly an email with your credentials and other important information. I encourage you to use this platform and the Secretariat is there to help you do so.

I would like to recall that the purpose of this exercise, as stated in the TPRM mandate in Annex 3 of the Marrakesh Agreement Establishing the WTO, is to achieve greater transparency in, and understanding of, Members' trade and trade-related policies and measures. It is <u>not</u> intended to serve as a basis for the enforcement of obligations under WTO Agreements, <u>nor</u> for dispute settlement purposes, <u>or</u> to impose new policy commitments on Members.

Finally, I would like to encourage those Group Coordinators who have not done so yet, to take advantage of the outreach programme offered by the Secretariat to brief groups, upon request, on the trade monitoring effort to further facilitate the participation of more Members in this exercise.
