THEMATIC SUB-GROUP SESSIONS MAY 18, 2023 THURSDAY 1:00PM-3:30PM

GUIDE FOR PRESENTERS

The break out sessions have been divided into seven clustered themes based on the Mindanao Development Agenda within the Philippine Development Plan of the Marcos Jr Administration.

Objectives:

The main objective of the break out session is to discuss the government's development priorities for Mindanao and discuss ways for collaboration with the ODA Community and private sector partners in aligning with these priorities.

Specifically, the thematic break out sessions hopes to:

- a) Discuss the status, challenges and gaps of the sector and the strategies and priority actions needed to facilitate sector growth;
- b) Identify priority areas for potential partnerships with the ODA Community and with the private sector in order to align with these priorities;
- c) Generate new insights on workable and practical approaches toward addressing the identified gaps from sector experts, industry players and development workers
- d) Explore opportunities for partnerships and for aligning future ODA development programs and projects for Mindanao with Mindanao's development agenda and priorities.

Guide:

- Presenter's Role. The presenter's role is to accomplish session objectives (a) and (b) listed above. The presenter is expected to give a short context of the sector performance in Mindanao, the priority gaps and challenges that need to be urgently addressed, strategies of how government is addressing these, and suggest areas where partnerships with and support from the private sector and from International Donor Communities can help complement efforts to address the identified sector challenges.
- Content of Presentations. The presenter, as the authority on the subject matter, has the prerogative to decide on the content of his/her presentation. To ensure that we are able to maximize the time aliotment, it is suggested that the following are covered:
 - a. Snapshot of the status of the sector or the sector performance in the Mindanao context;

b. Gaps and challenges, strategies to address these, and indicative priority programs for Mindanao;

c. Priority actions or areas where collaboration and partnerships with the private sector and the ODA Community will be most needed.

Notes:

- To maximize the time allotment, presenters may also provide links to Department websites or to the MDF Agenda Papers where details on the sector performance and status may be generated.
- Government Programs for Mindanao may be too many to include in the presentation. We suggest that, for purposes of the session objective, the presenter can focus on top 3-5 priority areas or programs which can be explored for future partnerships with ODA and private sector.
- 3. Agenda Papers. Agenda papers are short discussion papers which will be distributed to the participants for additional notes and contexts of the Mindanao Development Agenda being discussed. Presenters may also use the Agenda Papers for reference.
- 4. Time Allocation. Each presenter is given ten minutes (10mins) to fifteen (15mins) minutes for the presentation to allow for more time for sharing and open discussions.
- Submission of copies of presentations on May 15, 2023 Monday. To provide time for the Secretariat to organize all materials for consolidation in the kits and for presentations to be tested onscreen prior to the event, may we request that all presentation materials be sent to the Forum Secretariat on or before Monday, May 15, 2023.
- 6. Copies of the materials and presentations. Copies of all presentations, recordings and other materials of the session will be uploaded online. Links for access to the materials will be shared to all participants during the session.
