This refers to the ongoing preparation of Resilience Roadmaps with Investment Portfolios for Risk Resilience (IPRR) for Southern Leyte, one of the climate-vulnerable provinces of the Cabinet Cluster on Climate Change Adaptation, Mitigation, and Disaster Risk Reduction (CCAM-DRR).

With the continuing support of the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN Habitat), a series of consultations were conducted in developing the province's resilience roadmaps with IPRRs, through the Provincial Climate Risk Diagnostic (PCRD)
