This has reference to the letter from the Department of Trade and Industry – Regional Operations Group dated 15 September 2023, requesting additional information related to the ASEAN SME Policy Index (ASPI) 2024.

It may be recalled that on 17 April 2023, the Department submitted inputs to the study regarding ASPI 2024. Relatedly, on 12-13 September 2023, the DTI-Bureau of Small and Medium Enterprise Development (BSMED), together with the Philippine Institute for Development Studies (PIDS), Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA) and the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), conducted the National Validation Workshop to present the findings, resolve gaps and differences, and assess the initial results on the study conducted, particularly the existing policies and plans that help micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in the Philippines.

In this regard, we would like to seek your additional inputs/comments on the attached assessment grid and address the questions raised by OECD and ERIA (attached as Annex A) on Dimension 2: Environmental Policies and SMEs, specifically sub-dimensions 2.1 Environmental Policies Targeting SMEs and 2.2 Incentives and instruments for greening SMEs operations.

### **FINDINGS**

#### Planning and design

- The following strategies include environmental policies for SMEs: Philippine Development Plan 2017-2022 and 2023-2028; MSMED Plan 2017-2022; Investment Priorities Plan 2017; National Climate Change Action Plan 2011-2028; and National Framework for Physical Planning 2001-2030.
- No SME specific strategy is being implemented by the DENR's Environmental Management Bureau (EMB), but SMEs are included while regulating industrial and commercial
  establishments through several environmental policies.
- · DTI and DENR are responsible for providing environmental advice and guidance.
- Formal consultations take place between the public and the private sector, and there is an active network of public –private stakeholders.

#### Implementation

- Certain budget is available under the Philippine Environmental Partnership Program (PEPP). Otherwise, DENT does not allocate budget for SME-specific action plan.
- DENR's Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) is responsible for providing environmental guidance to SMEs.

#### Monitoring and evaluation

- DENR, through its EMB, conducts monitoring across industrial and commercial stakeholders.
- SMEs can be covered under the ECONA (Environmental Consent Agreement) which can allow the implementation of Environmental Management System Audit, a systematic
  and documented verification process of objectively obtaining and evaluating an organisation's compliance of environmental requirements.



## Dimension 2.2: Incentives & instruments for greening SMEs' operations



#### **FINDINGS**

- DENR developed and promotes the following programs for supporting industrial compliance: Philippine Environmental Partnership Program (PEPP): Industrial EcoWatch Program.
- . DENR's EMB provides support schemes and financial incentives to SMEs which exhibit above environmental performance. However, currently no SMEs have applied yet.
- The Philippines Green Jobs Act mandates providing incentives to business enterprises, including MSMEs, to generate and sustain green jobs.
   DTI's Green Economic Development (GED) aims to increase competitiveness of MSMEs by guiding them in implementing environment-friendly, climate-smart, and inclusive strategies to produce green products and services
- DTI conducted a series of formal and informal consultations with relevant stakeholders in the private sector and academia. Green financing events were also organised.

- No reports about the latest activities and accomplishments of the aforementioned programs. Last Accomplishment report was in 2021.
   DENR's 'Revised Guidelines for Pollution Control Officer Accreditation' provides guidance for business compliance with environmental policies through the designation of PCOs.
- The Climate Change Commission (CCC), in partnership with the ILO conducted several consultations with industry representatives and business associations to develop Green Jobs Assessment and Certification System
- The Philippines Sustainable Finance Roadmap and the Sustainable Finance Framework focus on provision of green, social and sustainability bonds.

#### Monitoring and evaluation

- DTI's regional offices monitor and evaluate progress of Shared Service Facility (SSF) program.
- The CREATE law mandates DOF to regularly evaluate and assess outcomes and impact of incentives granted to businesses/industries.
