#### TRADE POLICY REVIEW BODY

#### REPORT TO THE TPRB ON TRADE-RELATED DEVELOPMENTS

In preparation for the next series of trade monitoring reports, I would like to invite all delegations to provide the WTO Secretariat's Trade Monitoring Section (contact details above) with information on all trade and trade-related measures taken from mid-May 2023 to mid-October 2023, including any updates to and/or elimination of existing measures, including measures taken specifically in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.

As you will recall, I have been emphasizing the importance of transparency for the WTO as it is fundamental to any well-functioning global governing body. The outcomes of MC12 sent a strong signal in this regard and our work towards MC13 will continue in that spirit. Transparency directly affects the credibility of the work we do at the WTO and helps equip Members with up-to-date information on trade-related developments. In these efforts, the Trade Monitoring Reports (WTO-wide and G20) are unquestionably fundamental tools in enhancing transparency and predictability. Your participation in this exercise and your inputs are essential in assisting the Secretariat in the preparation of the Reports in the most accurate and comprehensive manner. I therefore ask for your support in providing as complete information as possible within the deadline.

Specifically, in providing information on trade and trade-related measures, for goods' trade, please indicate the HS Codes of the products concerned. In the area of services' trade, delegations are invited to provide information on changes to – or the introduction of new – measures affecting access to markets (in individual service sectors, in all sectors, and/or modes of supply) and conditions of operation of foreign service suppliers. In the area of intellectual property, information is sought on new developments or changes to existing policies. In cases where measures were already notified to the WTO, please simply refer to the document reference. In the area of general economic support measures, Members are invited to provide information on such measures – granted, modified, or withdrawn during this period - including industry specific and sectoral assistance.

It would be appreciated if your inputs could be received by Thursday, <u>21 September 2023 at the latest</u> to allow the Secretariat to prepare the relevant country-specific tables for your verification shortly thereafter. Measures taken between 21 September and 15 October 2023 will also be covered during the verification process.

Attached is an <u>illustrative</u> list of measures (restrictive or facilitating) affecting trade in goods, trade in services, intellectual property and general economic support measures covered by the Trade Monitoring Reports. With the objective of ensuring consistency in the format and length of information provided by Members, the attached suggested template provides details on the information requested. The same template can be used for both trade and trade-related measures as well as measures taken in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In July, Members successfully concluded the Seventh Appraisal of the TPRM, and I have noted the outcomes on Trade Monitoring. Specifically, the Secretariat will continue to implement and extend IT solutions that will facilitate the exercise for delegations, including through the digital platform for the submission and verification of measures online. The digital platform is also intended to assist delegations who have not previously participated actively in the Trade Monitoring Exercise and to

this end tutorials in the TMDB have been developed to guide you on how to use the new platform. Importantly, the use and development of the digital platform is a collaborative effort between the Secretariat and Members, and we look forward to your input in this respect.

I would like to recall that the purpose of this exercise, as stated in the TPRM mandate in Annex 3 of the Marrakesh Agreement Establishing the WTO, is to achieve greater transparency in, and understanding of, Members' trade and trade-related policies and measures. It is <u>not</u> intended to serve as a basis for the enforcement of obligations under WTO Agreements, <u>nor</u> for dispute settlement purposes, <u>or</u> to impose new policy commitments on Members.

Finally, I would like to encourage those Group Coordinators who have not done so yet, to take advantage of the outreach programme offered by the Secretariat to brief groups, upon request, on the trade monitoring effort, including the new digital platform, to further facilitate the participation of more Members in this exercise.
