Thank you for sending DENR representative Ms. Amisol Talania to the last Board meeting with Government Trustees on September 19, 2024.

We will sincerely appreciate if the Undersecretary or Assistant Secretary for Policy can attend the next Board meeting to give updates on the action points mentioned in the September meeting as follows:

- 1. On the list of plantations in Luzon: PHILEXPORT Trustee Bituin for Furniture was very much grateful for the list of Visayas-based wood suppliers that was provided to them. However, they prefer to source materials from Luzon suppliers, as it will be very costly for them to get legallyobtained raw materials from regions that are farther. For this reason, they are still waiting for the said list.
- On the 3% CITES fee: During the first PHILEXPORT-DENR TWG meeting on May 14, 2024, it was mentioned that a separate sub-TWG will be convened with Atty. Kabigting as the lead to address this issue.
- 3. On mahogany trees encroaching in the forests in Bukidnon: PHILEXPORT Trustee Gabor for Tourism raised this issue and strongly recommended that DENR swiftly act on this matter to save the Narra trees that are affected in the forests in Malaybalay, Bukidnon.

We will likewise appreciate receving the next schedule of the PHILEXPORT-DENR TWG meeting where we can discuss these matters prior to the next Board meeting on December 19, Thursday, 1:00 p.m. at the PHILEXPORT Showroom, ITC Complex, Roxas Blvd., corner Sen. Gil Puyat Ave., Pasay City and via Zoom. In case you prefer to attend the Board meeting virtually, we will send the meeting link after confirmation.

PART I

CALL TO ORDER

President Sergio R. Oriz-Luis Jr. called the PHILEXPORT Board of Trustees meeting with Government Trustees/Representatives to order at 1:00 p.m. He acknowledged and welcomed the government trustees/representatives who were present.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

On motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the proposed agenda of the BOT meeting was **ADOPTED**.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

On motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the minutes of the previous meeting were APPROVED.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

1) Export Development Council

A. Updates on the Philippine Export Development Plan (PEDP) 2023-2028

DED Valenzuela reported that the EDC in collaboration with DTI-Export Marketing Bureau successfully conducted the first leg of the series last August 20, 2024 for Region VII in Cebu City, with and Region VI-A (Iloilo City) joining via Zoom livestream.

The session was held in cooperation with DTI Region 7 and PHILEXPORT Cebu Chapter and part of a strategic effort to equip exporters and aspiring exporters with the tools and support needed to thrive in the global market.

Sharing the real value of the session for exporters, DED Valenzuela said that it also featured one-on-one export counseling with key government agencies such as the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), Export Marketing Bureau (EMB), Philippine Trade Training Center (PTTC), and Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHL). This direct access to expert guidance is designed to help exporters navigate challenges and capitalize on new opportunities, she said.

The remaining schedules are as follows: September 24 for Region XI-Davao City, October 2 for Region X-Cagayan de Oro City, October 4 for Region XII-General Santos City, October 10 for NCR, October 16 for Region IV-A CALABARZON and November 6 for Region III Pampanga.

Action points:

 EDC to provide further updates on the results of these stakeholder engagements.

 B. Updates on the COMELEC Gun Ban Policy

DED Valenzuela stated that the coordination meeting of the COMELEC-CBFSC was convened on April 16, 2024. The Office of the Special Assistant to the President for Investment and Economic Affairs led by Secretary Frederick Go held a meeting on May 17, 2024 to discuss this policy. In this meeting, concerns regarding the impact of the gun ban on key industries were raised, particularly in relation to operational restrictions and logistical challenges. The NCTPPS Secretariat is currently awaiting the agreements made during that meeting.

Action point:

- EDC NCTPPS to provide updates on the agreements in meeting.
- C. Updates on the amendments to the PPA and CAAP Charters
 The bills HB 1400 (Rep. Bernadette Herrera), HB 8055 (Rep. Midy
 Cua) and HB 10509 (Rep. Rufus Rodriguez) were all filed in the
 current 19th Congress and are still pending. Meanwhile, HB 5002 on
 the amendment of the CAAP charter has been pending with the
 Committee on Transportation since September 22, 2022.
 Action point:
 - EDC to provide updates on these bills, including the position paper that was mentioned in the June BOT meeting that EDC is supposed to be drafting to be co-signed with PHILEXPORT
- D. Updates on House Bill 4933 or the International Maritime Trade Competitiveness Act

H.B. 4933 has been pending since September 21, 2022 with the Committee on Transportation. Meanwhile, a counterpart bill (S.B. 2147) seeking to enhance the competitiveness of Philippine maritime trade was introduced by Sen. Jinggoy Estrada in the 19th Congress on May 9, 2023 and still pending in the Committee as of May 15, 2023.

Action point:

- EDC to provide updates on House Bill 4933 or the International Maritime Trade Competitiveness Act
- E. Updates on the implementation of the ATA Carnet System in the Philippines

DED Valenzuela remarked that the launch of the ATA Carnet system was done last July 15, 2024 marking the start of its implementation.

F. Updates on the CREATE Law

The congressional bicameral conference committee approved on September 10, 2024 the Corporate Recovery and Tax Incentives for Enterprises to Maximize Opportunities for Reinvigorating the Economy (CREATE MORE) bill which seeks to lower taxes on domestic and foreign companies to 20 percent from 25 percent, among other features.

2) Department of Finance

A. Updates on the ASEAN Single Window exchange of documents using TradeNet

There was no DOF representative in the meeting. The Department of Finance (DOF) and the Bureau of Customs (BOC) recently convened with the members of the ASEAN-USAID Partnership Program to discuss the development of the next-generation ASEAN Single Window (ASW) which represents a pivotal advancement in enhancing the Philippines' role in regional trade facilitation.

The session delved into the policy, legal, and technical aspects crucial to advancing the next-generation ASW. The Philippines' challenges in crafting policies and technologies for electronic document exchange with trading partners and the ASEAN Single Window were addressed in detail.

The ASEAN-USAID Partnership Program will provide the intermediate report on the study at the 68th TWG Meeting which is slated to take place in Cebu City from September 10 to 13.

Action point:

- DOF to provide updates on the TradeNet
- B. Updates on the Philippine Trade Facilitation Committee BOC called the 2nd TWG meeting on the 1st National Time Release Study (NTRS) on August 13, 2024 at DOF, Manila.

It was presided by the head of the NTRS-TWG Atty. Geniefelle P. Lagmay, Assessment and Operations Coordinating Group-Port Operations Service (AOCG) and Acting Director for the Port Operations Service (POS) assisted by the Secretariat from the BOC Time Release Study TWG. This collaborative effort will also involve other government agencies and private sector entities that issue permits or licenses. In the August meeting, they were instructed to submit their documentary requirements and processing time to DOF.

Action point:

DOF/BOC to provide updates on the PTFC

C. BIR Electronic Invoicing Project

Mr. Facunla from the Taxpayer Service Programs and Monitoring Division shared that the EIS is still under its pilot implementation and was made available only to identified business taxpayers under the jurisdiction of the large taxpayers' service after they have been duly notified. He added that the transmission of sales data is still ongoing. As of September 10, the total number of invoices transmitted to the EIS is about 243 million.

Noting that the EIS and its infrastructure is currently being evaluated for its stability and sustainability before expanding its implementation, Mr. Facunla further said that the Bureau plans to cover non-large taxpayers in the 4th quarter of this year but still waiting for the go

signal of their technical counterpart. Once approved, they will start writing those exporters classified as non-large taxpayers as the next target participants. One of the criteria to be chosen as pilot taxpayer to use the web-based issuance facility of the EIS portal is exporters with a maximum of 20 business-to-business average transactions per day.

Moreover, he mentioned that they will conduct the briefing or seminar to help understand and guide the taxpayers on how to use the webbased issuance facility of the EIS taxpayer portal. They plan to onboard them before the end of this year.

Considering that PHILEXPORT members are mostly composed of MSMEs, VP Leong inquired if they are allowed to use the portal even if they are not covered yet as part of training and preparing them to use it.

Mr. Facunla affirmed that MSMEs can use the system and for free. They will conduct a briefing for those chosen/identified taxpayers that will be included in the pilot implementation on the web-based issuance facility of the EIS taxpayer portal.

Further, VP Leong asked how soon the implementation will follow after the training, suggesting a transition period because it may take a while for others to be familiar with the system. She also mentioned about the issue of internet connection that may not be available nationwide.

Responding that it is still in the pilot implementation, Mr. Facunla explained that their target for the non-large taxpayers for the implementation is to identify 50 exporters claiming tax incentives. One of the criteria will be a maximum of 20 business-to-business transactions per day nationwide.

BIR to provide further updates on the EIS

D. Updates on the BOC CAO 01-2022, SMRMIR and E-TRACC There was no BOC representative in the meeting. On Aug. 8, 2024, EDC submitted a position paper to the BOC Committee on Anti-Red Tape seeking clarification on the Regulatory Impact Assessment (RIA) concerning Customs Administrative Order (CAO) 01-2024. The

paper highlighted concerns on the impact of fees and charges on stakeholder competitiveness, particularly in relation to the Clarification on the Procedure for the Collection of Fees and Charges outlined in CAO 02-2024.

In a meeting called by Finance A/Sec. Dakila Napao in July, stakeholders including EDC and PHILEXPORT proposed a reduction of the ETRACC fee now costing 500Php to 700Php, citing its adverse impact on competitiveness. He also suggested to BOC exploring automatic disarming of ETRACC devices for exports to lessen cost and time involved.

 The integration of cargo tracking services between the E-TRACC System and PEZA System was likewise discussed as a potential solution, with Trade U/Sec. Ceferino Rodolfo committing to arrange a meeting between PEZA and the E-TRACC service provider to address the issue.

Meanwhile, during the BOC-PHILEXPORT exclusive meeting on August 30, 2024, the BOC stressed that exporters are not exempted from the ETRACC system, but Commissioner Rubio committed to address the issues raised by stakeholders on fees, redundancy, and the arming and disarming of GPS tracking devices.

BOC also mentioned that all fees, including those under CAO 01-2022 and customs dues, fees, and charges are under review. Both the EU-ASEAN Business Council and the Export Development Council have expressed concerns regarding the increase in fees and charges.

In the same meeting, the BOC likewise shared that it is currently using a manual process for the Automated Bonds Management System (ABMS) due to the suspension of the Automated Import Management System (AIMS). The BOC announced that the suspension of AIMS is expected to last for approximately three months.

 BOC to provide further updates on the amendments to CAO 02-2022 and SMRMIR

3) Department of Environment and Natural Resources

A. Amendments to the DENR AO 1991-54 or the Wood Exportation Policy and CITES fee amounting to 3% of export value

Sharing the European Union (EU) policies on Carbon Border Monitoring (CBAM), VP Leong said it will first affect the bigger exporters with high carbon emissions like steel, cement and other industrial goods. Moreover, she introduced the EU Deforestation Regulation (EUDR) policy that covers products that tend to may cause deforestation will also be regulated by the EU. These include coffee, coco, soy, palm oil, wood, rubber, cattle and furniture. She believed that the policy will not be as impactful to Philippine MSMEs though, since there is still little export volume of these products to the EU. On the other hand, this policy offers an advantage for coconut exports to this region.

Ms. Talania reported that the DENR had a meeting last July regarding CITES and other fees. However, they still cannot provide other details and data that are supposed to come from DENR EMB. She shared that the agency was also busy with the budget hearing but promised to follow up with U/Sec. Leones to convene the TWG meeting to help address these issues.

Expressing her gratitude again for the copies of wood suppliers from the Visayas region, Trustee Bituin reiterated her request for the list of plantations in Luzon where they can source and buy legally, as it will be very costly for them to obtain legally obtained raw materials from regions that are farther.

Ms. Talana answered that they will coordinate with the FMB to provide these data.

Additionally, Trustee Bituin stated that she wanted to be an example against exporters and manufacturers using illegally-sources raw materials. She also shared about the flourishing furniture industry of Indonesia because of the ease in importing wood from the United States (US) as facilitated by its DA which is solely responsible for such plantations. She noted that the local furniture industry also needs this support to address its declining performance.

Yet, Trustee Bituin still believed that the industry can still thrive with support and help of the government, clients from the Foreign Buyers Association of the Philippines (FOBAP) and the EU which still values the workmanship and capabilities of the Philippines furniture industry compared with other country suppliers.

Trustee Young clarified that in fact, almost 80% of the foreign orders of FOBAP were already transferred to Indonesia because of the problems shared by Trustee Bituin. He urged DENR to urgently address the issues or the furniture industry will become extinct.

Meanwhile, Trustee Gabor raised the matter of mahogany trees that have already been encroaching in forests, resulting to the death of Narra trees in Malaybalay, Bukidnon. She advised DENR to swiftly act on the matter.

B. Hazardous waste

Mr. Tiocson of DENR-EMB stated that the official response to the concerns of PHILEXPORT is still for signature by the director.

Action point:

 DENR to provide updates on the TWG and the discussion of the above concerns.

4) Department of Agriculture

A. Issue on shrimp paste to the US

There was no representative from the DA in the meeting. During the June BOT meeting, Ms. Anne Frias-Lisbo of DA-AMAS shared a report from BFAR that aquaculture shrimps are allowed for export to the US. BFAR also has ongoing technical consultations with exporters and other stakeholders to acquire a certification from the relevant agency for exporting Philippine shrimp products.

VP Leong asked BFAR if it is aware of the volume of detained Philippine shrimp products at the US border. Trustee Gabor also

inquired if the Philippines has the capacity to immediately move to aquaculture shrimp farming. Ms. Lisbo replied that it is BFAR that can give answers to this. Having no BFAR representative present in the meeting, Ms. Lisbo gave the contact details of BFAR.

EVP Perlada asked the value and volume of aquaculture shrimp products from the Philippines. Ms. Lisbo assured the board that she will ask BFAR for the data and share it with PHILEXPORT.

5) Department of Information and Communications Technology

Dir. Ilano shared that with regard to MSMEs, they are still heavily promoting the use of eGov Super App. He then said that if exporters need any assistance, they will "gladly assist".

NEW ISSUES / FOR INFORMATION

1) BSP updates on recent economic and financial developments DD Quintos of the BSP reported that the country's real gross domestic product (GDP) grew by 6.3 percent year-on-year (y-o-y) in Q2 2024, due mainly to robust domestic demand and a significant increase in total investments. This growth was faster than the year-ago and quarter ago growth rates of 4.3 percent and 5.8 percent, respectively. The favorable GDP outturn was driven mainly by the broad-based expansion of services (e.g., wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles), and industry sectors (e.g., construction).

Headline inflation increased in Q2 2024 to 3.8 percent. As such, average inflation in the first half of the year settled at 3.5 percent. This is within the National Government's average inflation target range of 3.0 percent \pm 1.0 ppt for the year.

On policy rates, BSP highlighted that inflation was likely to continue to move closer to the midpoint of the 2 – 4 percent target range. Based on the BSP's latest survey of market forecasters, inflation expectations also remained well-anchored. The country's balance of payments (BOP) position registered a surplus of US\$1.2 billion in Q2 2024, a turnaround from a deficit of US\$1.2 billion in Q2 2023. The reversal to a BOP surplus in Q2 2024 was due to the significantly higher net inflows posted in the financial account notwithstanding the increase in the current account deficit.

As of end-June 2024, the maturity profile of the country's external debt remained predominantly medium to long term (MLT) in nature (with original maturities longer than one year), with its share to total recorded at 86,3 percent (or US\$112.29 billion).

Export sales in July 2024 amounted to \$6.249 billion indicating an annual increase of .1%.

On the exchange rate, the peso depreciated in Q2 2024 due partly to broad US dollar strength as indications of robust US economic activity and elevated inflation contributed to heightened market expectations of a delay in

This refers to the Philippine Exporters Confederation, Incorporated (PHILEXPORTs) 3rd Quarter Board of Trustees Meeting with the Government Trustees held at Milky Way Café, Antonio Arnaiz Avenue, Makati City and via Zoom platform on 19 September 2024, 1:00 PM.

The meeting was attended by the PHILEXPORT Board of Trustees headed by Ms. Myrna Bituin, along with representatives from various Government Agencies and the DENR, including the EMB-Hazardous Waste Management Section and the PPS-Policy Studies Division.

During the meeting, DENR provided updates on the conducted DENR Technical Working Group (TWG) for PHILEXPORT meeting. For. Amisol Talania of PPS-PSD informed that the DENR has already provided PHILEXPORT with data on Mahogany Exports in the Philippines based on CITES database. Other pending issues will be revisited again in the next TWG meeting.

Likewise, the EMB Representative informed the PHILEXPORT that the requested data regarding PCO Accreditation, Permit to Operate, Discharge Permits, etc., will be officially transmitted once the letter has been approved.

Additionally, the following action points for DENR were noted:

- 1. Coordination with FMB re: Data on Wood Products in Luzon; and
- 2. Development of a policy to address issues related to the encroachment of Mahogany Species in Forest Parks.
