PROJECT TRANSFORM COLLOQUIUM 2024

Theme: "From Science to Action: Transformative Pathways towards Resilience and Environmental Sustainability"

20 June 2024 | 9:00 am- 4:30 pm SMX Convention Center, Pasay City

Concept Note

I. Introduction

The Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028 states that "by 2028, communities, institutions, and the natural and built environment in the Philippines are more resilient to the impacts of natural hazards and climate change. To realize this goal, the government will strengthen cross-sectoral convergence and coordination and implement a comprehensive risk management approach to reduce intersecting vulnerabilities and address complexities in managing the compounding and cascading risks posed by climate change across different sectors."

The continuing challenges posed by climate change and disaster risks highlight the importance of resilient local government unit (LGU) systems that are able to develop and implement evidence-informed and inclusive resilience actions. The interconnectedness of risk, the stakeholders in each locality, as well as the development challenges of the Philippines heightens the complexities of resilience building.

LGUs often face difficulty in accessing relevant information that can aid in development planning and implementation, resulting in strategies that lean towards disaster response rather than resilience. Any intervention therefore must be practical, inclusive, and context-driven to ensure active community engagement in disaster risk reduction.

Risks contribute to the vulnerability-poverty cycle and these are linked to the broader national development context. The Philippines has always prioritized disaster risk reduction in addition to preparedness, response, recovery, and climate change adaptation and this is reflected in the Philippine Development Plan and other national plans and strategies. In recent years, the Philippine Government has emphasized the critical importance of local governance and community-based action that responds to the actual needs of communities. National Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) Plans highlight the need for actions to be "gender responsive, sensitive to indigenous knowledge systems, and respectful of human rights" (National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010) and for the country to have a "gender-sensitive, pro-children, and pro-poor perspective in all climate change and renewable energy efforts, plans, and programs" (Climate Change Act of 2009).

In this context, new strategies and mechanisms built upon the foundations of strategic partnerships will be even more critical as the need to transform towards adaptive and inclusive

governance and sustainable development can only be achieved through collaborative climate action and disaster risk reduction. By undertaking a programmatic and participatory approach that brings together a diverse set of implementing partners, more effective, efficient, and sustainable impacts can be achieved at the local level and at significant scale.

It is against this backdrop that the Department of Environment and Natural Resources partnered with the National Resilience Council, First Philippine Holdings Corporation, Philippine Business for Social Progress, Peace and Equity Foundation, and the Zuellig Family Foundation in developing Project TRANSFORM (Transdisciplinary Approach for Resilience and Environmental Sustainability through Multistakeholder Engagement).

The 2024 Project TRANSFORM Colloquium will provide a space for local governments to learn and share experiences along their resilience building journey. It aims to highlight how the multistakeholder approach in disaster risk reduction enables stakeholders to harness science and technology and local and traditional knowledge to inform both policy and practice at the local government level. It will showcase how the national and local governments (provincial, city, municipality, and barangay levels) are able to constructively link their current programs with the expertise, opportunities, and networks from their stakeholders from the private sector, civil society organizations, people's organizations, academe, and the local communities themselves. The colloquium will also highlight the importance of sustainability and development continuity in disaster risk reduction.

II. Objectives

- Highlight how Project TRANSFORM and the multistakeholder approach in disaster risk reduction is aligned with international commitments and national and local strategies, plans, and programs
- Provide a platform for local governments to showcase their accomplishments and milestones, and exchange experiences along their resilience journey
- Provide tailored capacity-building support to Project TRANSFORM Focal Points (DENR Regional Executive Directors and LGU representatives) on the development of their locality's Project TRANSFORM/resilience roadmap
- Strengthen local governments' knowledge and understanding on alternative and multistakeholder approaches for resilience investments
