#### **AN ACT**

GRANTING JURIDICAL PERSONALITY AND LEGAL CAPACITY TO THE BOARD OF THE FUND FOR RESPONDING TO LOSS AND DAMAGE DUE TO CLIMATE CHANGE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of the Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

**SECTION 1.** Short Title. – This Act shall be known and referred to as "The Loss and Damage Fund Board Act."

**SEC. 2.** Declaration of Policy. – It is the policy of the State to protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature.

As a party to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the Paris Agreement, the State lauds the creation of the Loss and Damage Fund (Fund) under the Decision 2/CMA.4 of the Conference of Parties serving as the meeting of Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) and during the 27th Conference of Parties (COP) to the under Decision 2/CP.27 of the COP, and its operationalization during the 28th COP under COP Decision 1/CP.28 and CMA Decision 5/CMA.5. The State resolutely welcomes its establishment to finance and assist the most vulnerable developing countries' response and recovery from losses and damages caused by climate change.

In recognition of the role that the State must take to advance climate and disaster risk resilience, it shall be the policy of the State to take a whole of government approach in creating concrete solutions and actions.

To further unlock opportunities in accelerating access to climate finance and investments which are critical for future-proofing the economy and ensuring sustainable and inclusive growth for all Filipinos, the State supports the hosting of the Loss and Damage Fund Board (Board) in the Philippines. Towards this end, the State recognizes the need to grant juridical personality and legal capacity to the Board to enable it to discharge its roles and functions.

SEC. 3. Juridical Personality and Legal Capacity of the Loss and Damage Fund Board. — The Board, as the governing body of the Fund established by the COP and CMA, shall be granted juridical personality with full legal capacity to:

(a) Contract:

(b) Acquire and dispose of immovable and movable property;

 (c) Institute legal proceedings;(d) Negotiate, conclude, and enter into a hosting arrangement with the World Bank as interim trustee and host of the Fund's

secretariat; and
(e) Undertake related or necessary activities to carry out the purpose for which the Board was created.

**SEC. 4.** *Privileges and Immunities.* – The Board, as an international organization, shall enjoy the status, immunities, and privileges granted under the host country agreement entered into with the Government of the Republic of the Philippines (GOP).

**SEC. 5.** *Tax Exemptions.* - The property, operations, and transactions of the Fund and its Board shall be exempt from the payment of all taxes, duties, and other charges imposed by the GOP and local authorities. The Fund and its Board shall also be exempt from any obligation for the payment, withholding or collection of any tax or duty.

The Fund and its Board shall be exempt from the payment of all taxes, duties, and other charges imposed by the GOP and local authorities, except charges for storage, transport and services supplied, on the importation of equipment, machinery, motor vehicles, and materials intended for use in the board meeting. The same shall be processed in the manner and under existing procedures applied by the Department of Finance in similarly situated cases.

The non-Filipino Fund officials and invited experts and observers shall be exempt from the payment of income tax on salaries, stipends, emoluments, indemnities, and sickness and accident benefits, received from the Fund, regardless of currency used. The GOP retains its rights to tax its own nationals. They shall likewise not be subject to taxes on their local purchases in the quantity as appropriate for the duration of the board meeting.

**A RESOLUTION**

AND THE GUIDANCE OF DENR SECRETARY MARIA ANTONIA YULO-LOYZAGA, FOR THEIR EXEMPLARY INTER-AGENCY AND WHOLE-OF-GOVERNMENT APPROACH IN WORKING TOGETHER TO SUCCESSFULLY HAVE THE PHILIPPINES BE SELECTED AS THE HOST COUNTRY FOR THE BOARD OF THE FUND FOR RESPONDING TO LOSS AND DAMAGE ESTABLISHED UNDER THE UNITED NATIONS FRAMEWORK CONVENTION ON CLIMATE CHANGE AND ITS PARIS AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 16 of the 1987 Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines states that "The State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature."

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Republic Act No. 9729, otherwise known as the "Climate Change Act of 2009", as amended by Republic Act No. 10174, states that "the State adopts the principle of protecting the climate system for the benefit of humankind, on the basis of climate justice or common but differentiated responsibilities and the Precautionary Principle to guide decision-making in climate risk management. As a party to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), the State adopts the ultimate objective of the Convention which is the stabilization of greenhouse gas concentrations in the atmosphere at a level that would prevent dangerous anthropogenic interference with the climate system which should be achieved within a time frame sufficient to allow ecosystems to adapt naturally to climate change, to ensure that food

production is not threatened and to enable economic development to proceed in a sustainable manner. As a party to the Hyogo Framework for Action, the State likewise adopts the strategic goals in order to build national and local resilience to climate change-related disasters."

WHEREAS, the same Section 2 of Republic Act No. 9729, as amended, further states that "Recognizing the vulnerability of the Philippine archipelago and its local communities, particularly the poor, women, and children, to potential dangerous consequences of climate change and global warming such as increasing temperatures, rising seas, changing landscapes, increasing frequency and/or severity of droughts, fire, floods and storms, climate-related illnesses and diseases, damage to ecosystems, biodiversity loss that affect the country's environment, culture, and economy, the State shall cooperate with the global community in the resolution of climate change issues, including disaster risk reduction. It shall be the policy of the State to enjoin the participation of national and local governments, businesses, nongovernment organizations, local communities and the public to prevent and reduce the adverse impacts of climate change and, at the same time, maximize the potential benefits of climate change. It shall also be the policy of the State to incorporate a gender-sensitive, pro-children and pro-poor perspective in all climate change and renewable energy efforts, plans and programs. In view thereof, the State shall strengthen, integrate, consolidate and institutionalize government initiatives to achieve coordination in the implementation of plans and programs to address climate change in the contest of sustainable development."

WHEREAS, the same Section 2 of Republic Act No. 9729, as amended, additionally states that "Further recognizing that climate change and disaster risk reduction and management are closely interrelated and effective disaster risk reduction and management will enhance adaptive capacity to climate change, climate variability and extreme climate events, the State shall integrate disaster risk reduction into climate change programs and initiatives."

WHEREAS, the Philippines has been historically active in the UNFCCC in advocating for climate justice and the full, effective and ambitious implementation of the principles and provisions of the UNFCCC and its Paris Agreement, including the principle of common but differentiated responsibilities and the precautionary principle.

WHEREAS, the Philippines through its negotiators has, historically and up to the present, coordinated, provided leadership, and worked with other developing countries in the United Nations climate change negotiations as part of the Group of 77 in advocating for the provision of climate finance and other financing support to developing countries to enable them to effectively undertake climate change mitigation and adaptation actions and other actions to avert, minimize and address the loss and damage arising from the adverse effects of climate change pursuant to the provisions and principles of the UNFCCC and its Paris Agreement.

WHEREAS, at its 27th session held on 6 to 20 November 2022 in Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt, the Conference of the Parties of the UNFCCC decided to establish new funding arrangements, including a dedicated fund, to assist developing countries in

responding to the loss and damage arising from the adverse effects of climate change, and furthermore established a Transitional Committee tasked to develop recommendations on the governing instrument for such dedicated fund over the course of 2023.

WHEREAS, the Philippines was a member of the Transitional Committee in 2023.

WHEREAS, at its 28th session held on 30 November to 13 December 2023 in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, the Conference of the Parties of the UNFCCC adopted the recommendations of the Transitional Committee for the governance and institutional arrangements of the Fund for responding to loss and damage, which included the establishment of the Board of the Fund to serve as the Fund's governing body.

 WHEREAS, the Board of the Fund is in charge of operationalizing the Fund and how it can be resourced and accessed to deliver needed financial support to developing countries that are particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change to help them avert, minimize and address the loss and damage arising from such adverse effects, and as such, the Board of the Fund has to be provided by a Host Country with the legal personality and legal capacity needed for discharging its roles and functions under its Governing Instrument and with the appropriate privileges and immunities for it to operate effectively.

WHEREAS, in his speech to the 28th session of the Conference of the Parties of the UNFCCC, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., called for "the immediate operationalization of the Fund to assist developing and vulnerable countries to respond to droughts, floods, and rising sea levels exacerbated by climate change," highlighting the urgency to confront climate change, stressing that "More than just an environmental issue; for us, it is a matter of survival, of justice, and of protecting the rights of our people," and announced the intention of the Philippines to host the Board of the Fund.

WHEREAS, the Philippines was elected by the Asia-Pacific Group to serve as a full member of the Board of the Fund for 2024 and 2026 and as an alternate member therein for 2025.

WHEREAS, under the leadership of the President and the guidance of Secretary Maria Antonia Yulo-Loyzaga of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) as the Official Representative of the President who chairs the Climate Change Commission (CCC), an inter-agency working group composed of the DENR, Department of Finance (DOF), Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), and CCC, with policy and legal advice from the Office of the Executive Secretary (OES), National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA), and Department of Justice (DOJ), and supported by technical experts and advisers, was established to develop and put forward the offer of the Philippines to serve as the Host Country for the Board of the Fund, host its meetings, and provide it with the legal personality and legal capacity needed for discharging its roles and functions and relevant privileges and immunities.

 WHEREAS, at its second meeting on 9 to 12 July 2024 in Songdo, Republic of Korea, the Board of the Fund unanimously selected the Philippines to be the Host Country for the Board of the Fund, after duly considering the bids of Antigua and Barbuda, Armenia, Barbados, Bahamas, Eswatini, Kenya, and Togo.

WHEREAS, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., in announcing on 9 July 2024 the selection of the Philippines as the Host Country for the Board of the Fund stated this "reinforces our dedication to inclusivity and our leadership role in ensuring that the voices of those most affected by climate change shape the future of international climate policies." The President further stated that the Philippines is "also honored to have a seat on the Board itself, ensuring that the Philippines will be a formidable voice in promoting and advancing global climate action — an issue of critical interest to the country."

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, by the House of Representatives, to congratulate and commend the officials and staff of the DENR, DOF, DFA, DBM, and CCC, with policy and legal advice from the OES, NEDA, and DOJ, under the leadership of His Excellency President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr. and the guidance of DENR Secretary Maria Antonia Yulo-Loyzaga, for their exemplary interagency and whole-of-government approach in working together to successfully have the Philippines be selected as the Host Country for the Board of the Fund for responding to loss and damage established under the UNFCCC and its Paris Agreement.

RESOLVED ADDITIONALLY, to commend the agencies, technical experts, and advisers included in the Delegation of the Philippines to the sessions of the Conference of the Parties to the UNFCCC and its Kyoto Protocol and Paris Agreement, including but not limited to the DENR, DOF, DBM, NEDA, Department of Agriculture, DFA, Climate Change Commission, Department of Education, Department of Health, Department of Science and Technology, Department of Interior and Local Governments, Department of Labor and Employment, Department of Tourism, Department of Trade and Industry, National Youth Commission, Philippine Commission on Women, Philippine Information Agency, Presidential Communications office, for their active involvement and proactive engagement in representing and advocating in the United Nations climate change negotiations for the interests of the Philippines, the Filipino people, and of developing countries that are particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change, most recently at the 28th session of the UNFCCC Conference of the Parties in December 2023 in Dubai, UAE, and the 60th sessions of the subsidiary bodies of the UNFCCC Conference of the Parties in June 2024 in Bonn, Germany.

**RESOLVED FINALLY**, that an appropriate copy of this resolution be given to the Office of the President, to the heads of the agencies referred to in this Resolution and those represented in the Delegation of the Republic of the Philippines to the UNFCCC, and to the technical experts and advisers of the Delegation.
