# Introduced by Senator Juan Miguel F. Zubiri

### RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC AFFAIRS TO CONDUCT AN INOUIRY IN AID OF LEGISLATION ON THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF POOR AND INADEQUATE INFRASTRUCTURE, FREQUENT POWER OUTAGES, AND INSUFFICIENT WATER SUPPLY ON THE TOURISM SECTOR WITH THE END IN **VIEW OF FOSTERING ECONOMIC, SUSTAINABLE, AND INCLUSIVE GROWTH IN** THE TOURISM INDUSTRY BY INTEGRATING AND ALIGNING REGIONAL AND NATIONAL ECONOMIC AND DEVELOPMENT PLANNING AND BUDGETING

WHEREAS, the Philippines, an archipelagic country with a rich cultural heritage and diverse natural attractions, has immense potential to become a top tourist destination in Asia and in the world;

WHEREAS, the Department of Tourism (DOT) reported a total of 5,450,557 international arrivals in the country from January 1 to December 31, 2023, of which 91.80 percent are foreigners, surpassing the country's target of 4.8 million international visitors projected to visit the country for the entire year;

**WHEREAS**, the tourism sector contributed 8.6 percent to the Philippine economy in 2023, underscoring the importance of tourism as a key economic driver;

WHEREAS, the total Tourism Direct Gross Value Added (TDGVA) amounted to PHP2.09 trillion in 2023, higher by 47.9 percent compared to the PhP1.41 trillion TDGVA in 2022, the highest growth posted since 2000;

WHEREAS, the sector comprises 12.9 percent of the total employment in the country in 2023 or an estimated 6.21 million, higher by 6.4 percent compared to 5.84 million in 2022;

WHEREAS, international tourism receipts reached PHP482.54 billion from January 1 to December 31, 2023, more than double the PHP214.58 billion visitor receipts in 2022 and reaching the pre-pandemic level of PHP482.15 billion;

WHEREAS, in terms of tourism expenditures in 2023, inbound tourism expenditure posted the highest growth of 87.7 percent, amounting to PHP697.46 billion while domestic tourism expenditure grew by 72.3 percent, amounting to PHP2.67 trillion;

WHEREAS, despite these promising figures, the potential economic benefits are hampered by inadequate infrastructure, frequent power outages, and insufficient water supply, which adversely affect both domestic and international tourists' experiences, as well as the cost of doing business and ultimately, the cost to consumers;

**WHEREAS**, in the World Economic Forum's Travel & Tourism Development Index 2024, the Philippines' ranking went down two notches to rank 69th out of 119 countries from 67th in 2019, highlighting the significant challenges in the availability and quality of infrastructure and tourism services, including air and sea transport infrastructure, road and railroad network, ICT infrastructure, power and water supply, and medical facilities, among others;

**WHEREAS**, Philippine airports, in particular, have been the center of a Senate inquiry for persistent unresolved issues, such as malfunctioning equipment, poor maintenance of facilities, and lack of adequate accommodations such as public seating for travelers;

**WHEREAS**, early this year, the DOT unveiled its National Tourism Development Plan (NTDP) 2023-2028, which include among its objectives the improvement of tourism infrastructure and accessibility, development of comprehensive digitalization and connectivity, and strengthening of tourism governance through close collaborations with national and local stakeholders, in order to transform the Philippines into a tourism powerhouse in Asia;

**WHEREAS**, it is incumbent upon the Senate to ensure that infrastructure investments, and other programs and projects are funded and implemented in a timely manner;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** to direct the Senate Committee on Economic Affairs to conduct an inquiry in aid of legislation on the economic impact of poor and inadequate infrastructure, frequent power outages, and insufficient water supply on the tourism sector with the end in view of fostering economic, sustainable, and inclusive growth in the tourism industry by integrating and aligning regional and national economic and development planning and budgeting.
