Inputs and suggestions were gathered from civil society organizations, non-government organizations, basic sector representatives, local government units, and national government agencies.

From September 23 to 27, 2024, the PHRCS facilitated a Writeshop with the treaty lead agencies to further refine the write-up of the different thematic chapters of the PHRP4. NEDA refined the draft Chapter 2 write-up, with inputs from agencies such as the Department of Housing and Urban Development (DHSUD), the National Housing Authority (NHA), the Social Housing Finance Corporation (SHFC), the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).
