SUBJECT : Authorizing the Foreign-Assisted Projects Management Office (FAPMO) to conduct an Orientation and Organizational Development Workshop at DAP Tagaytay from September 16 to 18, 1982

In view of the expanding scope of activities of the FAPMO as a result of the recent issuance of Memorandum Order No. 7 and Special Order No. 331, Series of 1982 (transferring the foreign-assisted project development activities and international relations); and in order to provide orientation particularly to the newly hired personnel of the Office, authority to conduct an orientation and organizational development workshop for the FAPMO staff is hereby granted.

The said workshop which will be held at DAP Training Center, Tagaytay City, is envisioned to formally organize the divisions of the FAPMO and define the functions and responsibilities of each division.

All FAPMO personnel are hereby authorized to participate in the said Workshop on official time. All expenses to be incurred during the Workshop shall be chargeable to the appropriation of the Natural resources development and management, including coordination of foreign-assisted natural resources projects (P.P.A. 1.1.11) subject to the availability of funds and the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
