SUBJECT : Designating DENR Field Personnel as Forest Community Organizers for the DENR-Upland Development Pilot projects.

1. Consistent with the Department's mission of developing the upland areas through the Integrated Social Forestry Program and cognizant of our thrusts of developing effective and efficient participatory strategies in program implementation for a more responsible stewardship of the environment and natural resources, the following personnel are hereby designated as a Forest Community Organizers of the Ford Foundation assisted Upland Development Pilot Projects at as indicated.

2. As a Forest Community Organizer, they are to jointly manage the projects with the Regional Upland Development Committee consistent with the provisions outlined under DENR Special Order No. 642 series of 1989 and other procedural guidelines and circulars to be issued specifically for the purpose of project implementation.


3. They are to carry-out the following specific duties and responsibilities under the supervision of their Social Forestry Officers:

- a. Validate the result of community appraisal, profiling or assessment survey of the biophysical, demographic and socio-economic conditions of the project area;
- b. Organize and mobilize community residents for the following activities:
  - i. Identification, analysis and priority setting of problems;
  - ii. Defining project area and individual farmlot boundaries;



- iii. Identification, planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of agroforestry and other related development activities responsive to the prioritized problems;
  - iiii. Settlement of land issues and conflicts and securing land tenure.
- C. Provide technical assistance and training to project participants in the following:
- i. the formation and development of forest community organizations;
  - ii. agroforestry project and livelihood enterprise development and management;
  - iii. assessment of existing farming practices and technologies;
  - iiii. resource identification, mobilization and management;
  - iiiii. management of land tenure-related issues.
- D. Facilitate formulation and implementation of training and education programs of the community;
- E. Facilitate the establishment of strategic and tactical linkages with resource institutions and other community organizations for a more effective agroforestry technology transfer and utilization, resource mobilization and project management; and
- F. prepare the forest community organization for eventual phase-out and project turnover at an appropriate time.


4. Considering the extent of involvement and magnitude of responsibility they have to attend to, they are to be relieved of other responsibilities in her office without being prejudiced to the support that is to be extended by the same for project implementation and personal career development.



5. They are to inform this office of their compliance with this order seven (7) days' upon receipt hereof.

6. In complying with this order, they are entitled to a reasonable incentive allowance, travelling and other incidental expenses that are to be charged from the regional allotment under the DENR Upland Development Trust Fund. These are, however, subject to the usual auditing rules and regulations. Specific guidelines for this purpose will be issued to the office concerned.

7. This order takes effect immediately and supersedes all previous orders and instructions inconsistent herewith.
