The evaluation team shall be responsible for the review and evaluation of the existing sub-classification strategies, mechanics and operational activities being undertaken by the DENR;

The Regional Offices shall provide the team their Regional Counterparts, not involved directly or indirectly in the in the implementation of the program, who shall assist them in evaluation activity. The Regional offices must also open/show all documents pertaining to sub- classification. They shall likewise provide the team, the transportation, accomodation and all support necessary for the facilitation of the activity.

The team is authorized to seek the assistance/services of employee of the Department and or any of its Bureau and offices in the pursuit of its task;

The team members are entitled to reasonable travelling expenses and per diems chargeable against funds of their respective offices, subject to availability of funds and existing auditing rules and regulations.

This order shall take effect immediately and shall remain enforced until the completion of the task.

#### Evaluation of the Sub-classification Program

#### I. RATIONALE/BACKGROUND:

The sub-classification original mandated under LCI 2262 stanted in 1983. Its orimany purpose is to classify and evaluate forest and other qualic lands for their most appropriate uses such as appropriately, pracing, or pounttive and protection forest canks and outcoor recreation lands, settlement areas, filandings and fishfarms and other potential uses (Driscoll et.al 1987). From the stant of the program to date, a total of 5.684.415 hectares of forest lands have been surveyed by the sub-classification teams. However, no croject has so far osen approved.

Actual implementation started in 1983 with 100 Land Classification Teams destroyming land classification as well as sub-classification work. The teams were then under the supervision of the Land Classification, Division of the trensument and Eureau of Forest Development. A total of 2,115.567 heptares have been sub-classified from 1984 to 1986.

With the reorganization in 1987. Land classification function was thensferred to NAMRIA while subclassification function was given to field operations. And under DAC No. 20 and 38 series of 1988 and 1990, respectively, the approval of subclassification of forest lands was given to pre Assistant Secretary for Field operations (Luzon, Vissyas, and Mindenso). From 1987 to 1990 a total of 4,768,848 nectares have been sub-thessified.

Cognizant of the importance of sub-classification as a vital input to land use planning, there is a need to ascentain the heal status of the sub-classification program.

## IV. Scope and Limitation of the Study

The study will cover only six (6) regions, namely Regions 4 5 for Luzon; Regions 7 and 8 for the Visayas and Regions 10 and 11 for Mindanad. Data dathered from these recions will be analyzed and evaluated to come up with the real status of the sub- classification program.

#### V. Methodology:

The study will itilize a case study nethod wherein interview and secondary date gathering will be done.

Perpandents. Rescondents will be dategorized into two sets. The first set of respondents constitute the fieldmen who actually perform the sup - diametrication tasks .such as site identification, mapping, pround verification etc. The second of respondence are those individuals who approves the recort and make the final evaluation of the recort.

Questions will dealt on the now, why and what of sub - classification. The second set is for vhose who approve the sub - plassification, and sò a more shorter, and very general questions will be raised.

Consultation with the Key Informents. After crafting evaluation report, a consultative forum will be held in Central Diffice to obeck and verify the findings have by team. Three (3) regions representing Luzon, Visayes.
