SUBJECT:

Authorizing the Human Resource Development Service to Conduct a Consultative Meeting with Partner Institutions on the DENR Foreign Scholarship Program

In the interest of the service and to assess the implementation of the DENR Scholarship Program, the Human Resource Development Service (HRDS) is hereby authorized to conduct a consultative meeting with partner institutions on the DENR Foreign Scholarship Program on February 13, 2004 at the Visitor's Center, Protected Areas and Wildlife Bureau (PAWB), Ninoy Aquino Parks and Wildlife, Diliman, Quezon City. The conduct of this activity shall be in accordance with the attached concept paper.

All expenses to be incurred shall be charged against the funds of the HRDS subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. A report on meeting shall be submitted within fifteen days after its completion.

CONSULTATIVE MEETING WITH PARTNER INSTITUTIONS ON THE DENR FOREIGN SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

RATIONALE:

For the past three years, the Human Resource Management Service, through the Career Management Division, has been conducting consultative meeting with its partner institutions. The activity started in Year 2000 as a meeting between the National Economic and Development Authority-Special Committee on Scholarships (NEDA-SCS) and HRMS to familiarize each other with the policies and procedures on foreign scholarship and training courses. The meeting proved to be fruitful as linkages were established and the line of communication was opened.

Encouraged by the results, the consultative meetings were expanded. HRMS invited other agencies such as the National Statistics Office (NSO), with which it is coordinating as regards foreign travels, training and scholarships.

This activity has also become an avenue for the assessment of performance and exploring ways to improve the system. It has also resulted into DENR being cited as the agency with the highest availment rate in foreign training in 2002.

OBJECTIVES:

General:

By the end of the meeting, stakeholders shall have reached agreements on areas of cooperation as regards the foreign scholarship program of the DENR.

Specific:

- 1. To assess extent of implementation of issues discussed during the last consultative meeting;
- 2. To discuss new issues and other developments affecting DENR and its partner institutions; and
- 3. To resolve issues and concerns that have been raised during the meeting.

The list of concerns and issues is attached.

DATE AND VENUE:

The activity is proposed to be held on February 13, 2004 at the Visitor's Center, Protected Areas and Wildlife Bureau (PAWB), Ninoy Aquino Parks and Wildlife, Diliman, Quezon City.

The consultative meeting would make use of discussions and open forum in its conduct.
